


























BELVEDERE INTERNATIONAL SCHOOL

All classroom teachers are asked to offer at least one free activity in order to collate accessible programs for all our students.

Rules for activities

Teachers/Instructors


- All teachers/instructors of Belvedere International School activities must be CRB checked.
- Activities must be planned properly.
- Activities must start and end promptly.
- Registers must always be taken and students that regularly don't attend must be chased up.
- If a teacher/instructor is unable to attend a session they must let the Senior Leadership Team know as soon as possible.
- Regular/weekly handing out of sweets and treats is not allowed. Occasional (such as once every half term) is permitted.

Students

- Students must be given clear guidelines at the start of the activity programme. They must be told the location, start time and end time of the activity and what equipment they need to
- Students must be told that they are expected to attend every week unless they hear otherwise from the activity leader.
- School rules apply, no mobile phones, no eating or drinking. Whilst some activities may be informal students must still be set clear boundaries of what is expected of them.
- If students misbehave the school sanctions policy must be implemented as in lesson time.


Paid activities
