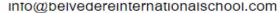

Policy

The school recognises that some students may experience difficulties in achieving age-related academic norms due to a variety of reasons, such as learning difficulties, emotional or behavioural issues, or language barriers. It is our policy to provide a supportive and inclusive learning environment that caters to the diverse needs of all our students, including those who are significantly working below their expected level for their age.

Procedures

Identification and Assessment:

Teachers will monitor the progress of their students regularly and identify those who are significantly working below their expected level for their age.

The school will conduct a thorough assessment of the student's learning needs and identify the underlying causes of their difficulties.

Parents or guardians will be informed of their child's difficulties and invited to attend a meeting to discuss the assessment results.

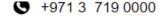
Development of Individual Education Plan (IEP):

The school will develop an Individual Education Plan (IEP) that outlines specific and bespoke learning targets, teaching strategies, and support services to meet the student's needs.

The IEP will be reviewed regularly and updated as necessary to ensure that it remains relevant and effective.

Teachers will be provided with training and support to implement the IEP effectively and monitor the student's progress towards achieving their learning targets.

Implementation of IEP:

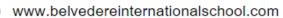
