Belvedere International School values the unique insight that parents can provide into their children's learning and acknowledge that learning begins and continues in the home environment.

By working in close partnership with parents, we seek to nurture in the children the development of trust, respect, confidence, independence, self-esteem and the desire to learn.

Aims:

- To communicate fully with parents to ensure that we all (parents, children, staff) have the same purpose in mind the needs, development and progress of the children.
- To involve parents fully in school life and the school community.
- To operate an Open Door Policy that encourages the fullest possible two-way communication between staff and parents; via scheduled appointments.
- To work in close co-operation with parents in order to ensure high standards of care and academic achievement for all of our children.
- To provide an environment inclusive for all parents and their children, regardless of need, background or culture.

Parents are welcomed into the school at mutually convenient times that are arranged in advance to learn more about their children's progress and to celebrate their successes. The school shall make opportunities available for parents to obtain information about the placement of their child in a teaching group, and their right to give their written approval of the proposed arrangements, if necessary. There are numerous opportunities throughout the year (both formal and informal) to meet together and get to know each other.

Meetings are arranged at a variety of appropriately scheduled times to enable as many parents as possible to attend. The school shall encourage parents to participate in extra-curricular activities organised by the school such as scientific, cultural, social, sporting or art events, after obtaining ADEK approval for them, and other relevant entities. The school shall encourage parents to take on voluntary participation in School and community events such as the UAE's National Day celebrations, graduation ceremony, and other similar activities and events, after obtaining ADEK approval for them, and other relevant entities.



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Formal Meetings

- Induction events for new parents.
- Open events for all new and existing parents to see the school at work and get to know the geography of the building.
- Initial welcome meeting in September to provide parents with information for the coming year, advice on the curriculum and events during the year ahead.
- Parent Consultation meetings in each academic term (1, 2 and 3) to provide parents with up-to-date information on their children's progress and set targets.
- Meetings to discuss, evaluate and update Individual Education Plans (IEP) for children with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND) and Able, Gifted & Talented (AG&T).
- Scheduled meetings between members of staff and parents of individual children and/or families. These are scheduled upon request from the member of staff and/or parents.

N.B. Students at BIS are treated as individuals and as such all issues are treated individually. Any requests from pairs or groups of parents for meetings with staff will not be granted in the first instance.If, following individual meetings, paired or group meetings are deemed appropriate and necessary by SLT, such meetings may be scheduled by the lead member of staff.
