Message from the Principal

Dear Parents,

At Belvedere International School, we recognize the vital role that technology plays in enhancing education. Used wisely, technology supports students' academic progress, improves engagement, and develops essential skills for the future.

However, we are equally aware of the importance of **balancing screen time** to ensure that students benefit from these advantages while minimizing the risks associated with excessive device use.

How We Use Technology for Growth

- Technology is integrated into lessons to monitor progress, support interactive learning, and encourage creativity.
- Devices are used purposefully during class, for specific learning activities, and often for limited periods to avoid unnecessary screen time.
- In some classes, students' personal devices are collected at the beginning of the day and used only when required.

Online Safety and Monitoring

To ensure a safe digital environment, the school maintains a **strict firewall system** that is continuously updated to block unauthorized applications such as games, messaging, and call services. Our IT team, along with the Social Work, Counseling, and Wellbeing teams, regularly deliver **awareness sessions on online safety and cyber security.**

We have noticed challenges with a few students attempting to use VPNs to bypass the school's firewall or accessing devices during break times. Please be assured that our teams are monitoring this closely and updating systems regularly to prevent misuse.

Working Together with Parents

Qe believe that promoting e-safety is most effective through a strong partnership between students, parents, teachers, and the school's leadership team. Together, we can:

- Reinforce safe internet and social media practices at home and at school
- Protect students' personal data and mental wellbeing.
- Encourage healthy limits on device use, especially during nonacademic times such as breaks or while waiting for pickup after school.
